In all instances, it has always been David Berkowitz who initiated press releases for his own reasons, and people who do not know him, nor have ever spoken to him, now proclaim HIS press releases as the Truth! While David surely comments in numerous letters to my brother and I, as to how he was grateful for encouraging him to write, my primary concern in getting him to write was to gain an insight into the mind of a serial killer, and hopefully, how we may learn to prevent similar occurrences in others nurturing similar traits. Whatever we are to believe about this man, these definitive writings of his are his only true legacy. For better or for worse; Welcome to the history of infamy, and into the mind of a serial killer.
