 3 This is a book for people who love finite elements and MATLAB. We will use the popular computer package MATLAB as a matrix calculator for doing finite element analysis. Problems will be solved

In particular the steps of the finite element method are emphasized in this book. The reader will not find ready-made MATLAB programs for use as black boxes.
