important role in

jetties, piers and wharfs is  
that jetties are frequently  
used for the transshipment  
and storage of light  
materials and ro-ro traffic,  
while piers are generally

used for heavy loads like  
iron ore. That is why piers  
are mostly designed and  
constructed like quay  
walls (which are beyond  
the scope of this  
handbook). The designs  
were originally based on  
trial and error and the  
insights of those who  
dared to conquer local  
conditions, such as wind,  
waves, currents and soil  
composition. Design and  
construction techniques

have since evolved into the designs we see on the coast or in river ports and seaports nowadays. The purpose of this handbook is to provide insight and guidelines regarding aspects that are important in the design of jetties and wharfs. Jetty-specific issues such as loads, interfaces between materials, installations on jetties and wharfs, as well as detailing aspects, are also covered.
