Who was the greatest of all American guitarists? You probably didn't name Gary Davis, but many of his musical

contemporaries considered him without peer. But in spite of his tremendous musical achievements, Davis never gained broad recognition from an American public that wasn’t sure what to make of his trademark blend of gospel, ragtime, street preaching, and the blues. His personal life was also fraught, troubled by struggles with alcohol, women, and deteriorating health. Zack chronicles this remarkable figure in

American music, helping us to understand how he taught and influenced a generation of musicians.
