Morgan also began drinking heavily because alcohol had the same anti-anxiety effect as his drugs -

Xanax. At his peak, Morgan was taking up to 20 mg per day -- ten times the maximum daily therapeutic dose. So in addition to being an addict, he was also now an alcoholic - a drunk. Warned of the dangers of combining alcohol and Xanax, Morgan did so anyway. In this case, it wasn't that $3+3=6$, but more like $3 \times 3=9$. And with his inhibitions gone while he was under the influence of drugs and booze, Morgan committed some of the most repugnant acts imaginable. Ultimately, this is a story of triumph. But before the victory over his addictions, Morgan had caused a lot of damage to his reputation, his career, his family -- and himself. Now "clean and sober," he tells his story --

something which he would not have been able to do during his active addictions and when he was in complete denial.

Forensic alcohol test evidence focuses on the evaluation, interpretation and application of the effects of alcohol or an alcohol test result to some legal issue such as a crime, accident or consequence of alcohol exposure. In FATE, many of the issues pertinent to a thorough forensic evaluation and trial testimony are discussed, but most importantly is the focus on consistent, unbiased, and

comprehensive application of diverse scientific disciplines and research to questions of forensic interest. Pursuant to a

congressional request, GAO studied the use of illicit drugs and alcohol among adolescents, focusing on the: (1) prevalence of drug and alcohol use among various groups of young people; (2) relationship between drug and alcohol use; (3) risk factors most related to drug and alcohol use by youth; (4) federal programs targeted at drug-use risk factors; and (5) policies that constitute a reasonable prevention or intervention strategy. GAO found that: (1) although drug and alcohol use among adolescents has declined from its peak in the late 1970s and early 1980s, there is still considerable underage drinking and illegal drug use among youth; (2) there is little

difference in drug and alcohol use between minority and white youth; (3) delinquency and early use of alcohol are significantly associated with the use of marijuana and cocaine; (4) risk factors vary for one-time users and those that use drugs over a period of time; (5) some researchers believe that the interaction of several risk factors determines the probability of drug use by youth; (6) poverty and place of residence are not significantly related to illicit drug use; (7) the federal government has 19 substance abuse prevention programs, most of which are targeted at high-risk groups; (8) other federal prevention funding is available for substance abuse

prevention activities; (9) current risk factor research does not provide information to develop targeted prevention strategies because of the varying risk factors among different drug-using groups; and (10) there is a consensus that prevention approaches that are comprehensive, community based, and collaborative are the most effective.

Motivation is key to substance use behavior change.

Counselors can support clients' movement toward positive changes in their substance use by identifying and enhancing motivation that already exists.

Motivational approaches are based on the principles of person-centered counseling. Counselors' use of empathy, not authority and power, is key to enhancing clients' motivation to change. Clients are experts in their own recovery from SUDs. Counselors should engage them in collaborative partnerships. Ambivalence about change is normal. Resistance to change is an expression of ambivalence about change, not a client trait or characteristic. Confrontational approaches increase client resistance and discord in the counseling relationship. Motivational approaches explore ambivalence in a

nonjudgmental and compassionate way.
