While *The Number of the Beast* morphs into something very different, more representative of later Heinlein works, *The Pursuit of the Pankera* remains on target with a much more traditional Heinleinesque storyline and ending, reminiscent of his earlier works. *The Pursuit of the Pankera* was never published and there have been many competing theories as to why (including significant copyright issues in 1977). Over time the manuscript was largely forgotten

but survived in fragments. A recent re-examination of these fragments, however, made it clear that put together in the right order they constituted the complete novel.
