The Disappearance of Signora Giulia Delta

Manuel Noriega is the only American prisoner of war. He may be a demon in the eyes of most Americans, but he has a unique and alarming view of the secrets behind U.S. relations with Panama and the real reasons for the 1989 invasion that removed him from power. Moreover, Eisner raises new questions about the allegations that Noriega was a drug dealer and a murderer. In fact, he concludes Noriega is not guilty of these charges. And then there is Noriega himself, a surprisingly savvy military man who saw himself as a nationalist, an honest broker between his allies in U.S. intelligence and his neighboring Latin American leaders. As Noriega tells it, his problems began when he began to resist the Reagan administration's efforts to fight communism in Central America. Il 17 ottobre 1975 fa la sua comparsa nelle edicole americane un numero speciale di *Esquire* che mostra in copertina la foto di profilo di un Truman Capote grasso e pallido, e una didascalia che reclamizza l’ultimo, attesissimo racconto dell’acclamato autore di *A sangue freddo*. Titolo: *La Côte Basque 1965*. Capote si è incamminato da tempo lungo la china dell’autodistruzione. Quasi costantemente in preda all’alcol e alle droghe, è soltanto una smorta controfigura del trentenne dagli occhi pieni di passione e inquietudine che sedusse il bel mondo newyorchese vent’anni prima. Su quel mondo, che lo ha tacitamente messo da parte, posa ora la sua astiosa penna, narrando del santuario che ne è al centro e che ha le sue vestali nei Cigni della Quinta Strada: Babe Paley, Slim Keith, Gloria Vanderbilt, Pamela Harriman, le regine dei cocktail, delle feste di beneficenza, dei party più esclusivi, dei dinner e dei lunch alla Côte Basque, il ristorante dove, appunto, pranzi e cene sono diventati un appuntamento imprescindibile della mondanità newyorchese. Il racconto di *Esquire* muove da un incontro alla Côte Basque in cui i Cigni della Quinta Strada si lasciano andare a inattese confessioni e riprovevoli giudizi. Slim Keith, riconoscibilissima nei panni di una pettegola e cattiva «ragazzona briosa e vitale», sposata con un soporifero lord inglese, spettegola e maligna su

una sfilza di personaggi ricchi e famosi: Jackie Kennedy, che sembra una versione caricaturale di se stessa, la principessa Margaret, così noiosa da far addormentare i suoi interlocutori. Gloria Vanderbilt appare talmente svampita da non saper riconoscere il primo marito. Ma è soprattutto con l'entrata in scena di Sidney Dillon, un «finanziere, consigliere di presidenti», sposato con una donna di nome Cleo, «la più bella creatura vivente», ma pronto a tradirla in numerose avventure extraconiugali, in sconci e sordidi incontri tra lenzuola sudice, che il racconto di Capote appare come un imperdonabile tradimento, un assassinio, una pugnalata inferta al cuore di uno dei Cigni in particolare, quello che tutte loro amavano di più e che persino Truman, anzi specialmente Truman, amava: Babe Paley, l'elegante e infelice consorte di «Sidney Dillon», alias Bill Paley, il fondatore della Cbs. Per Slim, Gloria, Pamela, il racconto di Capote ne fa di colpo un volgare nanerottolo, un bastardo scoppiato del Sud, una vipera che si è insinuata nel loro seno e che va subito schiacciata. Per Babe, però, *La Côte Basque 1965* rappresenta qualcosa di molto più importante: segna la fine dei suoi giorni dorati, della comunione perfetta, intima e accogliente con uno scrittore che, in pose languide e sensuali, guardava un tempo tutti dall'alto della sua grandezza letteraria.
