Little Wizard Stories of Oz is a set of six short stories written for young children by L. Frank Baum, the creator of the Oz books. The six tales were published in separate small booklets, Oz books in miniature, in 1913, and then in a collected edition in 1914 with illustrations by John R. Neill. Each booklet was 29 pages long, and printed in blue ink rather than black. The stories were part of a project, by Baum and his publisher Reilly & Britton, to revitalize and continue the series of Oz books that Baum had written up to that date. The story collection effectively constitutes a fifteenth Oz book by Baum. Baum had attempted to end the Oz series with the sixth book, *The Emerald City of Oz* (1910); in the final chapter of that book he sealed off the Land of Oz from the outside world. He began a new series of books with *The Sea Fairies* (1911) and *Sky Island* (1912). Also, he reacted to his 1911 bankruptcy by increasing his literary output: he produced five books that year,

his greatest output since 1907. To Write As If Already Dead circles around Kate Zambreno's failed attempts to write a study of Hervé Guibert's *To the Friend Who Did Not Save My Life*. In this diaristic, transgressive work, the first in a cycle written in the years preceding his death, Guibert documents with speed and intensity his diagnosis and disintegration from AIDS and elegizes a character based on Michel Foucault. The first half of *To Write As If Already Dead* is a novella in the mode of a detective story, searching after the mysterious disappearance of an online

friendship after an intense dialogue on anonymity, names, language, and connection. The second half, a notebook documenting the doubled history of two bodies amid another historical plague, continues the meditation on friendship, solitude, time, mortality, precarity, art, and literature. Throughout this rigorous, mischievous, thrilling not-quite study, Guibert lingers as a ghost companion. Zambreno, who has been pushing the boundaries of literary form for a decade, investigates his methods by adopting them, offering a keen sense of the energy and confessional force of Guibert's work, an ode to his slippery, scarcely classifiable genre. The book asks, as Foucault once did, "What is an author?" Zambreno infuses this question with new urgency, exploring it through the anxieties of the internet age, the ethics of friendship, and "the facts of the body": illness, pregnancy, and death.

The Riddle Columbia University Press Collection includes two typescript drafts of Edward Bloor's young adult novel, *Story Time*. The earlier draft, dated 15 December 2001, contains editorial comments and corrections from the author and the editor, Michael Stearns. The undated later draft includes corrections and comments from editorial staff at Harcourt.
