In this collection of new stories, *Beethoven Was One-Sixteenth Black*, Nadine Gordimer crosses the frontiers of politics, memory, sexuality, and love with the fearless insight that is the hallmark of her writing. In the title story a middle-

The historian in "History"

is a parrot who confronts people with the scandalizing voice reproduction of quarrels and clandestine love-talk on which it has eavesdropped. "Alternative Endings" considers the way writers make arbitrary choices in how to end stories—and offers three, each relating the same situation, but with a different resolution, arrived at by the three senses: sight, sound, and smell. *Dusk and Other Stories* Jump and Other Stories This is a passionate love

story; love between a man and two women, between father and son, and something even more demanding— a love of freedom.
