Section 376 states that if and when the act of rape is committed by

two or more individuals with common intention like gang rapes the criminals should meet the fate of death or life imprisonment. Although in many countries insults or defamation of any religion such as Islam is not a crime, in Pakistan this is one of the biggest crimes one can commit. Blasphemy is deemed a crime not only under the Code but also under Islamic law. The Code address the penalty and offenses relating to religion under section 295B and C. Subsection B punishes any defamation made against the Holy Qur'an with life imprisonment. Whereas, punishment under subsection C is for any written or spoken words direct or indirect made to defile the 'sacred name of Prophet Muhammad' will be punished by death or life imprisonment.
