Stephen King's Gothic reassesses the writing of this major contemporary Gothic writer through close and detailed readings of key works ranging from his earliest writings (*Carrie*, 'Salem's Lot', *The Shining*) to recent novels like *Duma Key*. Informed by and extensively applying concepts deriving from contemporary literary and cultural theory and engaging closely throughout with King's texts and with his comments in his own critical writings and interviews, the book argues that King's particular revisions of major Gothic themes, writings, and traditions, can best be understood as being closely related to his recurrent concerns with the act and products of writing itself. These concerns, Sears argues, are detectable across King's oeuvre and structural to his Gothic vision.
