Alleviating this problem, this book describes Monte Carlo methods as they are used in the field of electromagnetics.

to better illustrate the presentation of the different modeling principles and algorithms. Through its objective, approach and scope, this book offers a novel and systematic insight into the MEMS domain and complements existing work in the literature addressing part of the material developed herein.
