(1885–1930) was an English writer and poet whose work famously examined the results of industrialisation on contemporary society. In his novels and poetry, Lawrence explored a variety of then-controversial issues including sexuality and emotional health, which led many to label his work pornography. Today, he is considered to be one of the most important and influential writers of his generation. Lawrence's 1928 novel “*Lady Chatterley's Lover*” is the

story of the former Constance Reid (*Lady Chatterley*), a young woman married to an upper-class baronet who was left with lower body paralysis as a result of his participation in the Great War.
