The Wild Duck Henrik Ibsen This 1884 masterpiece may have its genesis in the hostile reception Ibsen - widely regarded as the father of modern realist drama - had received from the Norwegian public and critics for *Ghosts* (1881), which gave theater-goers a larger dose of truth than most were willing to bear. His next three plays - *The Wild Duck*, *An Enemy of the People* (1882), and *Rosmersholm* (1886) - focused on the consequences of telling the truth, or forbearing to do so. We are delighted to publish this classic book as part of our extensive Classic Library collection. He is the most frequently performed dramatist in the world after Shakespeare, and *A Doll's House* became the world's most performed play by the early 20th century.
