Or, in the words of former Sowetan editor and SANEF chair, Mpumelelo Mhabela: "Media freedom has nothing to do with the media, but with the freedom of citizens." And that is why you should know that a free media is the only guarantee for your freedom. As we have seen, both under apartheid and also under a democratic dispensation, it is a matter of a *luta continua*. The struggle continues. But you, the public, are the guardian of those that guard democracy. Help ensure the rights of a free media, and thereby your democratic rights and a democratic South Africa.
