Differentiated book- It has a historical context with research of the time- (Sonnets from the Portuguese) is a collection of love poems by the English writer Elizabeth Barrett Browning (1806-1861), published within the 1850 anthology: Poems (Poems). The Portuguese Sonnets cycle was written between 1845 and 1846, and consists of 44 magnificent sonnets, probably the best love poems by Elizabeth Barrett Browning. It is said that, at the beginning, Elizabeth Barrett Browning was reluctant to publish the collection, considering it too personal. However, her husband, the poet Robert Browning, insisted that it was the best English poetic cycle since William Shakespeare's sonnets, and finally convinced her to publish it. All the poems of Sonnets of Portuguese reflect the sentimental relationship between Elizabeth Barrett Browning and Robert Browning. To soften

the intimate character of the work, and especially to hide their identities as main sources of the poems, the author decided to give her an ambiguous title, as if they were actually translations of Portuguese sonnets. The book was finally titled: Sonnets from the Portuguese. The play was effective, since for many years it was thought that those love sonnets had really been translated from Portuguese.

Written between 1845 and 1846, Sonnets from the Portuguese is a series of love poems written by Browning to her husband, the prominent Victorian poet Robert Browning. Although Elizabeth was initially unsure of the poems, Robert encouraged their publication, suggesting she title them to make readers believe they were translations and not personal declarations of love between the couple. Using the sonnet, Browning adopted a traditional form made famous by Shakespeare while staking a claim for herself as one of nineteenth century England's premier poets. Filled with references to the Greek pastoral poet Theocritus and the tragic figure Electra, as well as invocations to God, Sonnets from the Portuguese immerses itself in biblical and classical tradition while remaining deeply personal and authentically romantic. Sonnet "XV" addresses the inherent tragedy of love, the depth of sadness with which a lover beholds another with "Too calm and sad a face," overwhelmed with the knowledge that with love comes "the end of love, / Hearing oblivion beyond memory." In sonnet "XXVIII," Browning reflects on the distance between lovers kept apart: all she has of him are her letters, "all dead paper, mute and white!" And yet, "they seem alive and quivering" in her "tremulous hands," a living reminder of the man she longs to be with. "XLIII," the most famous sonnet of the collection, begins "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways," and records the poet's confession of a love

more powerful than "the passion put to use / In [her] old griefs..." Not only has her lover brought her such joy, he has also given her a love she "seemed to lose / With [her] lost saints," a love strong enough to transcend religious faith entirely, a love that is destined to last, and to be even "better after death." With a beautifully designed cover and professionally typeset manuscript, this edition of Elizabeth Barrett Browning's Sonnets from the Portuguese is a classic of English literature reimagined for modern readers.

Elizabeth Barrett Browning is perhaps the most famous and well received female poet of the nineteenth century. She was an iconoclast, known for her courageous and transgressive views. Her liberal and progressive ideas have surfaced in much of her poetry. In *The Runaway Slave At Pilgrim's Point*, she writes down about one of the social issues that plagued her times, that of slave trade. Such poetry was heavily charged with political as well as religious ideas. Indeed, she was also an eminent religious writer, as can be seen in many of her works like *A Musical Instrument*. When one reads all of her poetry, one finds that an ambivalent picture arises. Elizabeth Barrett Browning also wrote about the treatment of women in the nineteenth century. Heavily influenced by the work of Mary Wollstonecraft, whose controversial book *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman* (1792) set the tone for later feminist writings, many of her own works saw the recurrent themes of exploration of "The Woman Question". In poems like *The Romance of the Swan's Nest* and *The Romaunt of the Page*, she criticizes the way women are peripheralized in society.

The result is a collection of some of the loveliest and most poignant words written on romance and marriage in all of English poetry. Perhaps the most famous of her verses is the beautiful "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways", which is a timeless statement of love and devotion. All together in this representative selection are included a total of eighty-three works which exhibit the breadth of Elizabeth Barrett Browning's poetic virtuosity. Some of her poetry has been noted in recent years for strong feminist themes, but the poems for which Elizabeth Barrett Browning is undoubtedly best known are Sonnets from the Portuguese. Written for Robert Browning, who had affectionately nicknamed her his "little Portuguese," the sequence is a celebration of marriage, and of one of the most famous romances of the nineteenth century. Recognized for their Victorian tradition and discipline, these are some of the

most passionate and memorable love poems in the English language. There are forty-four poems in the collection, including the very beautiful sonnet, "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways."

The collection was acclaimed and popular in the poet's lifetime and it remains so today. Barrett Browning was initially hesitant to publish the poems, believing they were too personal. However, her husband insisted they were the best sequence of English-language sonnets since Shakespeare's time and urged her to publish them. To offer the couple some privacy, she decided to publish them as if they were translations of foreign sonnets. She initially planned to title the collection *Sonnets from the Bosnian*, but Robert proposed that she claim their source was Portuguese, probably because of her admiration for Camoens and Robert's nickname for her: "my little Portuguese." The title is also a reference to *Les Lettres Portugaises* (1669)."
