








At its meeting in

Copenhagen in July 1954, the DICC adopted as part of its programme "the realization of a clinical atlas". However, the time to do the planned book of illustrations was not ripe until the national committees and international organizations had officially recognized the 28 classifications of malignant tumours at various sites as presented in the third edition of the TNM Booklet edited by M. Harmer (TNM Classification of Malignant Tumours, 1978). This was all the more important since publication of the Booklet was followed in 1980 by publication of a Brochure of Checklists, edited by A.H.
