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Obsessive-Compulsive and Related Disorders: A Critical ...Obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) features a pattern of unwanted thoughts and fears (obsessions) that lead you to do repetitive behaviors (compulsions). These obsessions and compulsions interfere with daily activities and cause significant distress. You may try to ignore or stop your obsessions, but that only increases your distress and anxiety.

Types of Treatment for Obsessive-Compulsive and Related ...Other Specified and Unspecified Obsessive-Compulsive and Related Disorders - this category can include obsessive jealousy characterized by excessive focus on a partner's faithfulness, and body-focused repetitive disorders (other than hair pulling or skin picking) like nail biting or lip and cheek chewing.
